RESOURCES

Language for Life (in Dutch: Taal voor het Leven)

Language for Life (in Dutch: Taal voor het Leven) is a pilot program executed in 2013-2015 in six Dutch regions. Language for Life gives those who want to improve their basic skills, the chance to do so in their own familiar surroundings. Hundreds of local partners work together in combining the strength of the

combination of support from literacy volunteers, professional teachers close by, high quality teaching materials with opportunities to put the lessons learned into practice. Within Language for Life several instruments have been developed, such as the Literacy Screener, a course for Literacy Volunteers, Literacy Houses, course material, campaigns and models to set up partnerships and cooperations.

Companies & Literacy (in Dutch: [Bedrijven en alfabetisering](#))

Stichting Lezen & Schrijven works together with job agency Randstad to find and educate job seekers with literacy difficulties. Job seekers that apply with Randstad Uitzendbureau in Groningen and Zwolle are tested with the Literacy Screener. This test gives an indication of whether or not they are potentially low literate. If so, they are redirected to the appropriate literacy course provider in the area. Following a literacy course with which job seekers improve their literacy skills, likely increases their chances of finding an appropriate job through Randstad Uitzendbureau.

Konzept Förderung der Grundkompetenzen in betriebsnahen Kursen

Das ist ein Konzept für Kurse zu Grundkompetenzen in Betrieben und mit einer computergestützten Lernplattform.

Rund 15% der Wohnbevölkerung der Schweiz fehlen ausreichende Grundkompetenzen (Lesen und Schreiben, Alltagsmathematik und Informations- und Kommunikationstechnologien), um den Anforderungen von Alltag und Beruf gerecht zu werden. Eine zunehmende Anzahl von Betrieben stellt bei Mitarbeitenden mangelnde Grundkompetenzen fest. Das beeinträchtigt die Leistung des Betriebs: es entstehen längere Einarbeitungszeiten, Kommunikationsprobleme, Produktivitätsverluste und ähnliches.

Vor diesem Hintergrund führte die **Volkshochschule Bern (vhsbe)** im Auftrag **der Erziehungsdirektion des Kantons Bern** und im Rahmen des nationalen Projekts Literalität in Alltag und Beruf (LAB 2009 - 2013) Kurse in Betrieben durch. Aus den Erfahrungen im Projekt resultiert das vorliegende Kurskonzept.



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
